At the Mid-Point...The Future Looks Bright!

The Phi Chi Theta Educational Foundation is starting to reap the rewards from the investments we have made in "Building the Future" of Phi Chi Theta – a future that looks bright. Our donations have increased over 50% from the same time last year. This is attributed to the increased awareness of the Foundation and its programs through our consistent and timely outreach campaigns. As well as through specialized fundraisers including the Auction at the 2006 National Meeting, Macy's Charity Day, and our most recent fundraiser the **Phi Chi Theta Alumni Cruise**. The future looks bright as we launch two new year-long fundraising campaigns to support the Foundation's scholarship and educational programs.

In January, we launched our "**\$207 in 2007**" campaign, where we are asking our members and chapters to commit to making a pledge of **\$17.25/month** to the Phi Chi Theta Educational Foundation by giving up one less Starbucks per week. That savings over the course of a year translates into a donation to the Foundation of \$207. Representing over **20% of a \$1,000 scholarship** that we can award to members of Phi Chi Theta. Who wouldn't be willing to go with one less Starbucks a week for a year, knowing that it is going towards a great cause?



This month, we launch the "**Searching for Pennies**" campaign. It's simple and **FREE**. All it takes is click of the mouse, a web browser, and something you want to search for on the Internet. Take a Lesson from the Pros—Filling Out the Scholarship Application

For this issue of eEd-News we asked the scholarship winners to share with you what it has meant for them to win the scholarship, the opportunities and professional validation that it has brought each of them. We also asked them to share with you some tips and things to be aware of as you begin filling out your scholarship application that is due on May 1.



“Winning the Helen D. Snow Memorial Scholarship was an honor. I am so proud to represent my chapter, Zeta Gamma, and the University of Illinois as a national scholarship winner. Winning the scholarship was another reassurance that hard work does pay off.”

Tips on filling out the scholarship application:

- Start early! The process is time consuming!
- Make sure you ask people that know you well for your recommendations. Always give them a short note that includes some of the things you have accomplished in college and specifically in PCT. Include your goals and aspirations too. Lastly, follow up to make sure the letter was sent. Provide the writer with an addressed and stamped envelope!!!
- Have someone else read your essays for spelling, grammar and coherence!
- Check the application over, and over! Make sure that there are no errors and that all parts are included before you mail it.

Tips on filling out the scholarship application:

- Be honest and write from the heart. PCT was a huge part of my life at school and was the best decision I made at PSU so I made sure that message was clear.
- Find someone to write you a recommendation who knows how much the fraternity meant to you.

My advice to future applicants for a PCT scholarship would be to just be truthful and honest, and show how you have contributed to the development of Phi Chi Theta, as well as your community. A misconception that I perceive about the scholarship is that you have to be on the executive board in your chapter to apply; however, this is not the case since every active member has the opportunity to create great strides in Phi Chi Theta and their communities.

- Take your time! Don't fill it out in one sitting.
- Go over it several times to make sure it says exactly what you want to say.

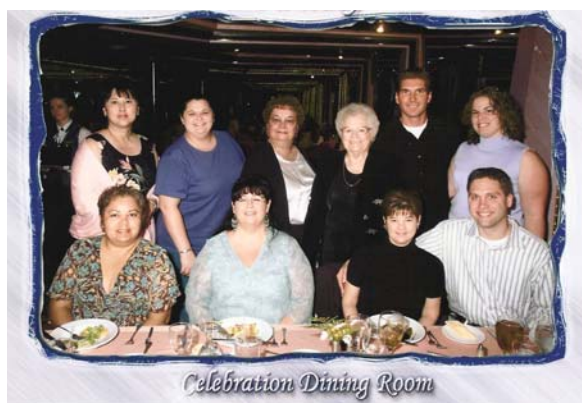
